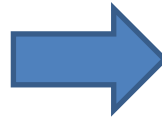

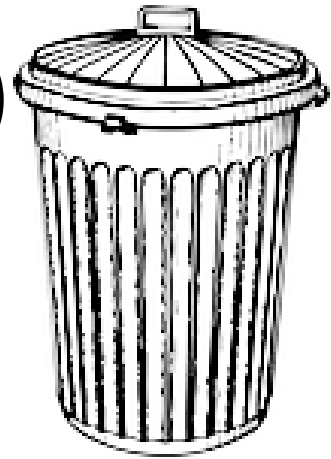

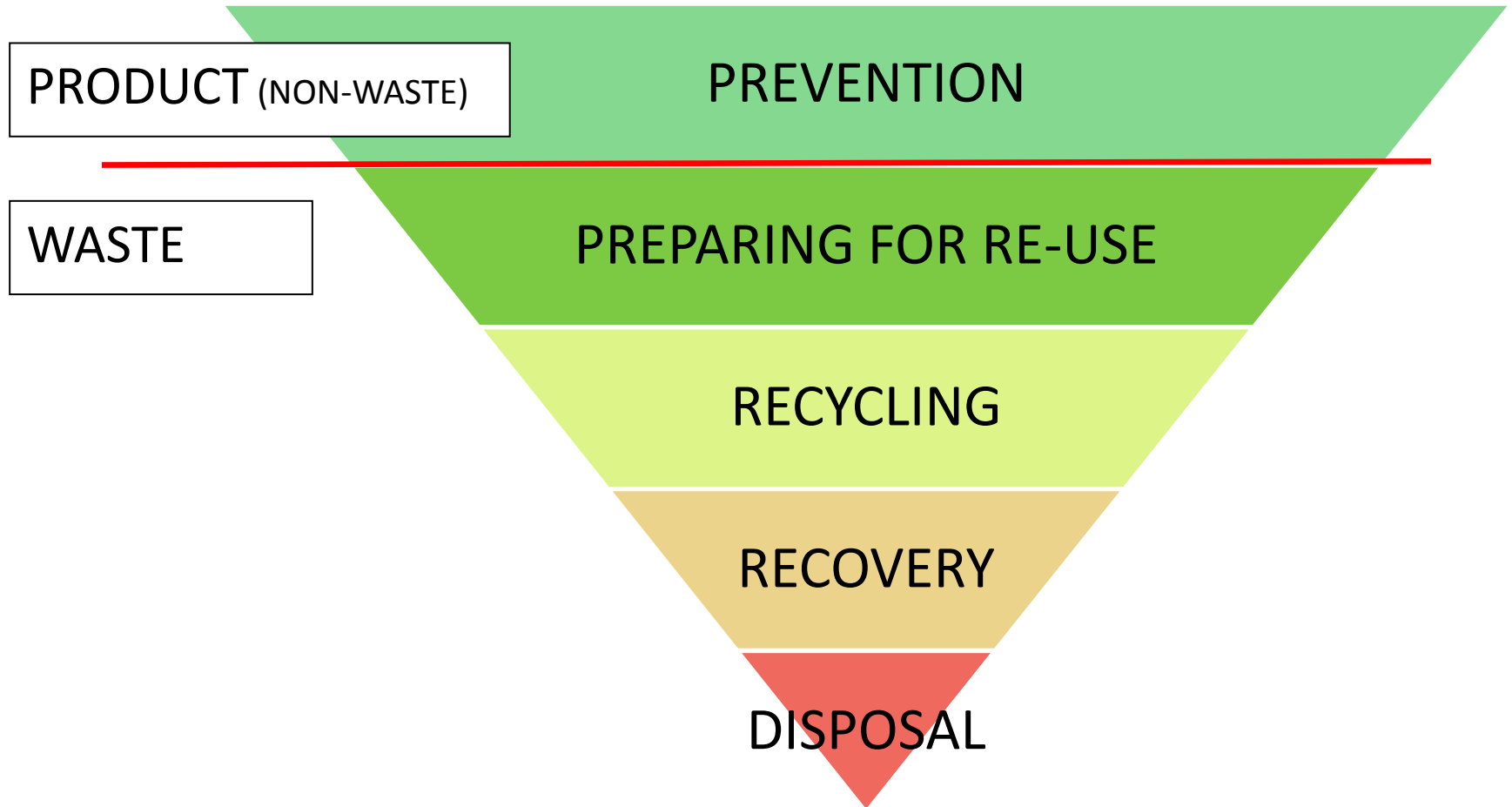

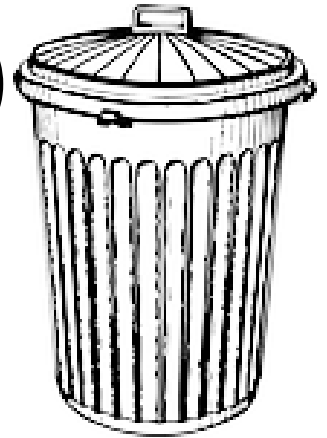


EU Waste Hierarchy

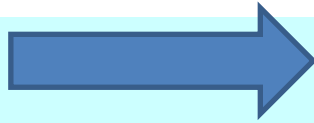

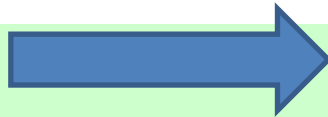

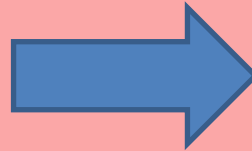
