

A Brief History...

- Integrity Ambassador Program launched in 2010.
- EthicsGame's learning tools were an integral part of that program.
- After four years, completely integrated into the undergraduate program, covering 6 different classes over a four year program.
- In addition, the learning tools have been integrated into the MBA program, included in 12 different classes over a two year program.
- During the last academic year, 660 learners participated in the program.








Values in Tension

Critical Thinking in Action

Be Intelligent

- Identify the stakeholders
- Explore the perspective of the decision maker
- Identify what you can and cannot ethically do

Be Attentive

- Attend to the context
- Notice facts and assumptions
- Identify and explore values in tension

Be Reflective

- Evaluate your decision
- Reflect on results
- Seek continuous improvement

Be Reasonable

- Use analytical tools for each lens
- Identify best options for each lens

Be Responsible

- Choose best course of action
- Correct for bias
- Communicate your decision



This instrument is divided into three sections. For each section, mark the statement or the word that most accurately describes your personal values. While we make choices based on factors other than our core values, how we work and play with other people - our ethics - is determined by our core values. The goal of an ethically mature person is to have our values match our actions.

As you complete the inventory, remember that no answer is "better" or "worse" or "right" or "wrong." We each have a unique mix of values that identifies us as an individual in the human family. The accuracy of the instrument depends on how honest you are in answering the questions.

Part I: For the following statements, mark the box that most accurately describes your personal

- 2. When faced with a new experience, I prefer to:

- 5. When someone comes to me with a problem, I tend to:






Ethical diversity


