Conclusion:

- Leaders of participating BSs did not convey the impression steering business to help humanity is one of their main roles
- Each type of attitude can be understood individually

But together they will lead to continued expansion in global use of resources and worsening of other UGIs








Further Research


- Extend the study to broaden its geographical and cultural spread, including China and America
